Paul Quare our much loved and respected fixtures secretary and probably the finest hooker to grace our grass, (plastic and real) has passed away in recent days and we ask all to help us mark our respect with a minutes silence at kick off. DMP RFC 58 - 5 BURNAGE

Burnage slipped to their heaviest defeat in several seasons at the hands of table toppers Darlington Mowden Park.

Conditions were perfect up in Darlington and there was plenty of excellent rugby on display. Unfortunately it was all played by the home side.

DMP, based on the two performances Burnage have witnessed, are the strongest side in the division by some distance and were clearly in a confident mood. An early scrum against the head was a surprise for Burnage, allowing Rob Wellock to make an early break for the line which was thwarted by good cover defence. The early optimism soon disappeared though, as DMP enjoyed almost all of the ball in the first half with a nice front foot platform. That, and some unenthusiastic tackling

BURNAGE 2S 79 - 5 PENRITH 2S

Young prop Mike Stopford led the way with 4 tries as Burnage inflicted a second heavy defeat of the season on their Cumbrian visitors.

The first match, played on the grass in glorious early season sunshine, produced a scoreline of 76-7 and it was a very similar story this time on the artificial surface with 13 tries for the home team and just one in reply for the visitors, who were not helped by going down to 14 men for the latter stages of the match, allowing Burnage to pile on the points at the end of the game.

The squad for this week was: Andy O'Sullivan, Martin Vernon (c), Mike Stopford, Sean Spratling, Rob Mckinlay, Matt Grellier, George Birtles, James Taylor, Tom Blaney, David Rees, Joe Burke, Andy Ascroft, Adam Blaney, Freddie Wilson, Liam Cowley. Reps: Nathan King, Josh Merrick, Omar.

Some last-minute withdrawals and a call up to the 1st XV squad for Jamie Redmond gave skipper Martin Vernon some selection headaches before the match but he was pleased to be able to give Rob Mckinlay a 2nd XV debut in the second row with James Taylor switching to Number 8 as a result. George Birtles was set for an interesting game against his home club and the presence of both Blaney brothers added to the Cumbrian connection.

A minute's silence before kick off for club stalwart Paul Quare was well observed by both sides. It has been a

very sad week for the club and the 2nd team were keen to put on a good performance in tribute to Paul and to give the loyal home crowd a lift. Aided by some soft penalties conceded by Penrith, the home team got off to a quick start and it wasn't long before a series of forward drives down to the left led to Sean Spratling stretching a long arm over the line for the opening score, his first try of the season. Further tries weren't long in coming: Mike Stopford charged over for his first two of the day, Martin Vernon added one of his own, Tom Blaney darted over following another good series of phases by the forwards and brother Adam was given the benefit of the doubt on the grounding in the corner following good work from Liam Cowley and Joe Burke. Freddie Wilson was also hauled down just short by some great cover defence by Penrith.

A healthy lead then, but the home team's scrum was being disrupted by a big, powerful Penrith pack and a few too many turnovers and missed tackles were giving the visitors opportunities to get back into the game. The 15 minutes or so before half time was a very poor period for Burnage and our failure to put their big ball carriers on the ground allowed them to organise a series of driving mauls which caused us big problems. Eventually the direct approach paid off for Penrith and they were able to get on the scoreboard with a pick and go from close to the line.

Some deserved criticism from TFL, Martin Vernon and some of the senior

players at halftime refocused Burnage minds on the task that lay ahead of us in the second half and sure enough we were able to add to our lead soon after the break. Penrith rarely made it into the Burnage 22 during the second half and most of the possession went Burnage's way as well, assisted by an improved effort at the scrum and dominance at the lineout, where Penrith's failure to compete gave Martin Vernon and Sean Spratling an easy afternoon. David Rees sidestepped his way through to score twice, while Stopford was pretty much waved through to complete his hat-trick and then add a fourth. Adam Blaney has obviously been taking lessons from Shaun Gilmour as he decided to run sideways all the way around the Penrith defence to score a second of his own and Peruvian recruit Omar came off the bench to grab a popular brace of tries in an impressive performance on the wing. As with Adam Blaney's first try, the grounding in the corner for Omar's first might have been worth checking with the TV official but with that option not yet available at Varley Park the ref gave him the benefit of the doubt. There was no doubt at all about his second, Liam Cowley unselfishly fixing the last man before teeing the replacement winger up for a simple stroll across the line.

By this late stage, Penrith had lost their hooker to a gruesome looking facial injury, with what looked like an egg trying to force its way out through the skin near his eye. We wish the player a speedy recovery and hope the lump is just bruising and nothing more serious. Going down to 14 men certainly did little to help the visitors keep the scoreline

down but they kept going in the face of adversity.

In addition to Omar's eventful cameo, fellow replacements Nathan King and Josh Merrick also caught the eye. Nathan scrummaged well and also had a couple of trademark trundles, one of which saw him scythed down just short of the line and another which required him to go backwards ten yards like a wind-up toy car to build up some power before exploding forwards for twenty yards in the right direction. Josh came on in the back row to replace Rob Mckinlay with about 20 minutes to go and used his speed to make two or three good breaks through gaps he had spotted in the tiring Penrith defence. Freddie Wilson again went close to a try of his own and it is very encouraging to see four products of the Burnage Colts set up (Freddie, Mike, Joe and Josh) playing so well together at senior level in the 2nd XV squad.

Overall this was a very convincing victory that consolidates our position at the top of Conference B with 4 wins out of 4. We hope that the great man PQ would have enjoyed the performance and I am sure that, as a hooker, he would have been particularly impressed that five of the tries came from front row players. Next week will be an away game against in-form Vale of Lune and we will hope that we can transfer our recent good performances at home on the 3G onto a grass pitch. With quite a few missing this week, next Saturday's selection looks set to be very tough indeed.

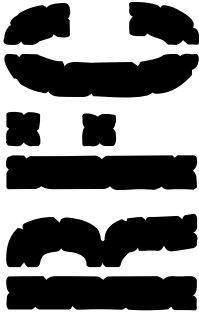

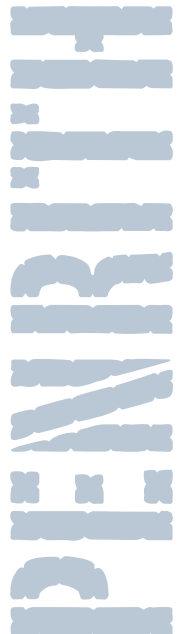

2011/2012 OUR 75TH SEASON



In 1936 the rugby players who were soon to leave the new Burnage High School decided to form a team to continue their involvement in the game. The school had been opened in 1932. They managed to put together a fixture list for the 1937-38 season and for a new team did quite well, winning 11 and losing 9.

Burnage's first pitch had been at the school and this was followed by use of Stenner Lane Farm where, although they made some acceptable changing facilities, the club was dogged by flooding and soon moved to Nell Lane for the 1948-49 season.

Following the move in 1949 Burnage RFC was proposed by Broughton Park RFC and seconded by Sale FC for membership into the Rugby Football Union. This was granted in time for the 1949-50 season.

On the 24th September 1952 Burnage were at last able to rent a ground of their own where we built a small wooden clubhouse, later to be extended by purchase of a wooden garage.

By 1955 the club were able to purchase the land from The Lord Egerton of Tatton, of

whom it was said could travel from Knutsford to Manchester on his own land.

The clubhouse served us well until 1976 but by then the need for another pitch was great, as 3 and sometimes 4 teams were sharing the one pitch at the clubhouse, whilst another was being rented the short distance away at Parrs Wood house. At this time the club pitch was often in wet condition due to clay soil it was located on.

In 1976 we grasped the opportunity to purchase our present ground on which we built a clubhouse and maintained 3 pitches. The new clubhouse was opened on 24th October 1976 by Georgina Varley, who was the widow of Bill Varley, one of the founder members of the club.

By this time Burnage had an excellent reputation for running charity games, where many county and England players turned out.

In 2002, the clubhouse was vandalised and set on fire which gutted the interior, destroying all inside except the All Blacks signed ball, which one member now had at home.

The club was refurbished, and with the new additions of a boundary fence, the much improved car park, the five aside pitch and floodlights, our facilities were the best they had ever been, with much more to come. The latest being the addition of the 3G pitch.

On the playing side, our 4 teams have gone from success to success culminating in our 1st XV being promoted to National League 3 in 2011.

Paul had, and more importantly demonstrated, all these virtues, showing his love for everyone at every opportunity. He was dedicated, loyal, interesting, intelligent, fun and always good company. That's why everyone, bar none, loved him so much.

Paul had all the qualities we would like to see in ourselves but know we fall short. Paul was not just a drinking buddy, although he captained that ship as well. He would always make time for people; getting to know them in a soft, gentle and caring way.

He was well read, a technology expert, a fervent humanist, looking to do the right thing especially for those less privileged. He could engage in enlightening conversation with people from all walks of life, including those peculiar folks from Burnage RFC. Paul always managed to hit the right note.

A stalwart and very capable hooker, scoring senior rugby tries in five consecutive decades, with international

matches from the Isle of Mann to Cuba, Paul will be best remembered for his wicked and most importantly benign sense of humour.

We all know that a fulfilled life is not about wealth or job titles, what matters most is caring, sharing, friendships, respect and being a steadfast role model to those around you. Paul led a rich and fulfilled life.

For those who knew Paul, today will inevitably be tinged with sadness. We will have to deal with our grief in our own personal way. However I am sure Paul would want us to remember him with a smile on our face, his impish humour winning everyone over. We hope the following anecdotes will help.

We miss you Paul.





I remember going to Cuba with Paul. By the 6th day we were all sick of the fizzy larger when Paul "said" he'd found a bar selling real beer. He was sat at a table supping his brown ale and we couldn't get the Spanish speaking water to understand we all wanted the same. No matter how loudly we shouted or how much we pointed. Paul of course had brought the bottle with him and had been patiently waiting for just this moment.

Paul turned up for a game with a very fresh black eye. We asked him what had happened and he said, rather sheepishly, that he'd had a couple of scoops at the Griffin, come home, stumbled over a pile of newspapers in the front room and smashed his head against the lawn mower.

Paul was one remarkable person. I went to his office in Manchester Uni, the only space left in the room was a slight amount of desk space in front of his VDU. You couldn't even sit down.

Paul and I dressed up to go to a top casino in Mar del Plata, I wore my white 'tropical' DJ, Paul his 1956 ex-moss bros DJ, complete with moth holes. We thought we were very, very slick. We entered with flourish and panache only to find a whole load of beer-swilling South American jobs in shorts and flowery shirts. But we carried it off by losing vast amounts of funny money on roulette.

On being approached by an Argentinean "working girl" in one of their less salubrious bars she softly whispered into his ear "hello big boy, buy me a drink?" Paul, frowned, raised an eyebrow and tilting his head to one side replied "but your not in our kitty".

Paul, a keen paddler, had to miss an entire season as frogs had spawned in his canoe, however this enforced absence from the water did not afford him enough time to complete his Mini Moke kit car which he'd been working on for over 10 years, in his bathroom.



One of our favourite wedding presents was a bottle of sumptuous home made sloe gin beautifully packaged in a Heinz Tomato Sauce Bottle.

Having bonded on a shared residential education experience Paul had me ranting and raving at the injustice of Dover Military College discipline which Paul regaled in great length and detail, including the strapping 1st year's to the College Ceremonial cannon and blasting them to oblivion on the parade ground in the event they had committed a particularly heinous crime, thereby setting a suitably stern example to the assembled College ranks . My indignation continued unabated until Ross and Barrett could contain their sniggers no longer.

Whilst preparing for a fancy dress breakfast Paul's room mate Phil, who had previously cut squares from his only pair of swimming trunks to make fetching red epaulets, let out a shriek when he forced a pre-heated plastic bin on his head in an attempt to get a snug fitting French Foreign Legion helmet. Fortunately

Paul gallantly rescued this doomed attempt at sartorial elegance by rummaging through his suitcase, picking out a 1970's Ward Air carrier bag from one of an assortment of 50 plus, triumphantly chirruping "this'll do it" as he flourished a rapidly perishing bicycle inner tube. Paul proceeded to cut "rubber bands" from the tube and by interlinking them saved the day with an elasticated chinstrap. I suppose for all of these you had to be there, I'm glad I was.

Some eager young things (EYT's) wanted to recreate the 1st Gala Day but, somewhat recklessly for Burnage, sought to take it up market and grandly call it the South Manchester Show. During the intervening years the fabled culinary experience that was the Rotting Dog Curry House had been whispered about but for many not experienced. The EYT's desperate to incorporate one of the 7 wonders of Burnage consulted with the Dog's Master, Yoda-Paul, and earnestly shared their concern that the Dog's name could detract from this prestigious event. Paul listened intently, acknowledged our trepidation and promised to see what he could do. Paul duly reported back that the Dog's Ents had had a meeting, were sympathetic to our plight and Paul had been authorized, on his recommendation, to say we could change the name to the New Rotting Dog Curry House. Paul's decision was subsequently vindicated when the Manchester Evening News came

out with a full page spread headlined "Suzi Quatro and the Rotting Dog".

Ever the entrepreneur Paul extended the franchise to include the Rotting Dog Sweet Centre on BRFC's New Year Day Golf Challenge. These sugary delights ranged from mouth watering, to ones that put Hogwarts snott filled chocs to shame. Our foursome arrived at the sweet center and puckered up. After a precise, if complicated, formula where your golf score was multiplied by the number you threw on a dice and then divided by the number you achieved on the roulette wheel, your mystery bonbon was decided. My playing partners were delighted with their selections so up I stepped, after protracted rule checking and adherence to the formula my sweet was identified. The experience is still too traumatic to describe, suffice to say I have since had counseling which I hope will one day resolve my issues. One observer remarked on how unlucky I'd been. Paul smiled and said "Not really".

Who else has ever used their concessionary bus pass to a senior game of rugby and then scored a try.

I had joined Burnage from Marple and lets say it wasn't the most amicable of splits. I was at No 8, Paul was at hooker, the score was 0-0 with a few minutes to go. A scrum 20 metres from there line, their put in, I whispered to Paul, please give me this one against the head. Low and behold with the cleanest of strikes he won the ball, I was able to pick up and trundle over the line and we won. One of my greatest moments in my playing career, thank you very much Paul for that, rest in peace, a more likeable and respected man would be difficult to find

Paul was a true gentleman of Burnage RFU. I recall recently speaking with Paul after he had his cruciate knee ligaments reconstructed which he thought would be the end of his long rugby career. When he asked me about how I had recovered from my knee reconstruction, I said that I was back playing rugby within six months. He rethought about hanging up his boots, got



himself to a level of fitness that many normal twenty and thirty year old chaps would have been envious of, and donned his shorts again. He was and is a Burnage legend - God blessed me in knowing him. Rest in peace matey

One of my favourite memories of Paul is as a member of the geriatric front row together with myself and Colin Rowley. With Paul at 58, myself at 56 and Colin at 55 we had a combined age of 169 but still enjoyed some great games.

My first rugby tour to Antwerp in 2010 was the first opportunity I had to meet Captain Quare. After playing alongside him and numerous beers, we were stood next to each other when a certain 80's song came on. It was at this point that Paul turned round to me and said that I should give him a hand to get up and he would show me how to walk on the ceiling. After realising he wasn't joking I supported him as he walked up the walls and on to the ceiling in front of his cheering teammates. As soon as he touched the roof he lost his grip on me and fell full distance to the floor. He got up, finished his beer and carried on chatting as if nothing had happened. The legend of Spider Quare was born.

My abiding memories of Paul, or PQ as he was commonly known, will be of a very quiet and unassuming man who was immensely loyal and dedicated to our rugby club. He dedicated much of his own time to helping the club with often mundane admin matters, which have helped us progress to bigger and better things. He never moaned, even when asked to rush through registrations and he always had time to speak with you over a pint of ale and always had a cheeky smile

to offer. He was a true gentleman and it is testament to him that I have only ever heard kind words spoken of him.

As a rugby player, my fondest memory of Paul was on the tour to Edinburgh in 2008. We had already played a game on the Saturday and had another one to get through on the Sunday, with double the hangover! Despite having near enough 50 tourists we were struggling to get a team together as all manner of excuses came out of the woodwork from 1st XV players and other more spritely types. Never one to shy away and someone who loved to play rugby, PQ was chomping at the bit and put in a great shift, almost racing (well, sauntering anyway) over from the 22 midway through the 2nd half. Paul was stopped short of the line, but I had never seen him run so far and I'd have loved to have seen him score. No doubt the celebration would have matched his normal demeanour - a wry smile and been very understated, ready to be discussed over a pint after the game.

Talking of pints, another of my favourite memories of Paul was of him wandering the clubhouse offering a sip of the extra strong cider he had brought up from another visit to far off climes (well down south anyway). Whether he was genuinely proud of this super strength apple brew or just wanting others to help him see off his drink (on account of the bitter test), I will never know, but I'll be certain to raise a pint to our old friend today. He will be very sorely missed, but fondly remembered.

A then spinster of this parish enjoyed a 'special relationship' with PQ and they both met up in Manchester and shared a glass of wine or two at Cellar Vie (one of the very few wine bars in the city centre

at that time). In a civilised fashion and typically of PQ this lady was invited for Sunday morning coffee at his home. When she arrived the coffee was available but unfortunately no milk. PQ then went to the local shop to buy some. Whilst he was out it became apparent that there was nowhere for said lady to sit as all surfaces were covered in 'stuff'. Each chair had papers on and the table hosted what looked like bits of car parts. Needless to say, and typical of her gender, papers were moved, (tidied) and mugs washed and arranged on a now clear space on the

The game had started at the 'KKK' end of Edgeley Park, with Mr Quare not present. Twenty minutes in Paul arrives and the assumption is made that a cheeky one at the Vic held greater attraction than the Sharks. None of it declared Paul, I had to wait for the black pudding sausage rolls-our half-time snack-to come out of the oven, bloody good they were too.

Queuing for a racey rubber boat ride at Salou water park, all seemed safe. As the more mature and decidedly lightest of the crews we were expecting nothing more

than a leisurely slide down the flume. However, our raft had a will of its own, we went faster down; higher out of the flume and hence wetter at the bottom. Soaked; bedraggled and unnerved, Paul spluttered 'that was interesting ,shall we go again, as the laws of dynamics shouldn't have resulted in us drowning'-No.



table. PQ returned with the milk and instead of delight at the reorganised living space, he was very quiet and obviously not happy. Later that day he phoned his ' friend ' to terminate the relationship as it was obvious to him that they did not share the same values and before he was 'tidied' he knew where everything was and now he couldn't find a thing!!!

To add a post script . We have remained friends and Paul will be remembered by all my family with fondness and appreciation of knowing him ."

Another story I have was the only time Paul blotted his perfect disciplinary record by being sent off in a vets game. I think it was against Manchester Vets on the pitch

in the far field. Following a collapsed maul near the opposition try line, Paul rose to find the referee pointing at him. The referee said "deliberately striking a member of the opposition. Off you go". Paul of course had hit nobody and his only crime was being mistaken for Councillor Jones who by this time had run away to hide. Not bad one mistaken sending-off in five decades!!

My favourite one was from that tour to Cornwall when we all got nicked for the signs. Paul went into the little sweet shop

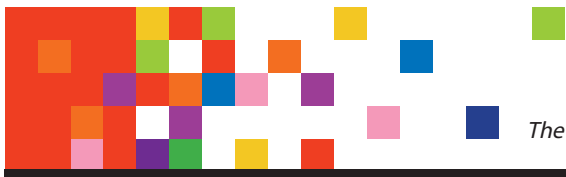
and ordered about 8 or 9 bags of different boiled sweets, paid for them and was leaving when the lady said, "Excuse me but you've left your sweets!" to which Paul replied, "Oh I didn't want them. I just wanted to pay for them!" and left. I thought I would die laughing at the shop lady's expression.
