# Between the Posts

*What a great delight it was to see Budda get his hand on the ball first and I let my emotions show. First to the ball but was there downward pressure? That is the sort of decision you have to leave to the referee and he said "Yes!". Who am I to argue?*

*The Scunthorpe lads did not agree, although to their credit they did not unnecessarily harangue the referee but their full-back was quite adamant that it was my shout which persuaded the official to allow the score.*
