Y Gêm Heddiw (Today's Match)

Dychwelir pêl droed Cwpan Cymru yn nôl i Gae Brenin Siôr V heddiw yn ail rownd ragbrofol y gystadleuaeth yn dilyn buddugoliaeth gyffyrddus Llan yn erbyn ein cymdogaion Nantlle Vale yn y rownd gyntaf.

Ond mae un peth yn sicr, ni fydd y gêm heddiw yn un hawdd o bell ffordd. Bydd Clwb y Fentur, sy'n chwarae yn y "Welsh National League" (Ardal Wrecsam) yn mynd i mewn i'r gêm yn ffefrynnau clir. Llynedd roedd y clwb yn anlwcus iawn o beidio cael dyrchafiad i'r Cymru Alliance pan orffenodd eu hymgyrch dim ond ddau bwynt tu ôl i'r pencampwyr. Maent yn un o'r ffefrynnau am y bencampwriaeth eleni a bydd capten y clwb Mark Brown yn awyddus o godi'r gwpan ddiwedd y tymor. Cadarnhaodd tîm John Halton ei lle yn yr ail rownd gyda buddugoliaeth gyffyrddus o dair gôl i ddim yn erbyn Bodedern Athletic. Mae wedi bod yn ardderchog yn y gynghrair hyd yma hefyd, nid ydynt wedi colli gem hyd yma gyda phedair buddugoliaeth mewn pum gêm.

Today see's Welsh Cup football return to King George V Field in a second qualifying round of the competition following Llan's comfortable win against neighbours Nantlle Vale in the first round.

However, today's match will certainly not be an easy one. Welsh National League (Wrexham Area) Premier Division side Venture Community are clear favourites. The club narrowly missed out on promotion to the Cymru Alliance last season by two points and are sure to be one of the favourites to lift the title this year. John Halton's men secured their passage through to the second qualifying round with a comfortable 3-0 home win against a strong Bodedern Athletic side. Their league form to date has been excellent too with an unbeaten start to the campaign (four wins coming from the opening five matches).

Third time lucky for Llan by Kev Sheret

If anyone ever wanted to see an advert for Llanllyfni's never say die attitude, they should have attended last night's tie with Bontnewydd.

Bont have started the campaign strongly with some cracking wins against current league champions Bro Gornowy and most recently Bangor City. Peter Garlick has been busy over the summer months strengthening his Bont side and the additions of Steven Tindall and Aaron Parry from Caernarfon Borough and the experience of Simon Kay and former Llan player Gareth Griffiths from Caernarfon Town has held them in good stead over the first few matches.

The match kicked off with Bont taking the Rhedyw Road End, but that didn't seem to upset Llan too much as they quickly got into their passing game. That passing game was clear to see when Gavin Owen released Aaron Hughes with a delightful through ball that split the Bont defence only for the marksman to be denied by the post. However, as previously stated in match reports, mistakes are punished in this league. Confusion in the Llan box following a

corner, closely followed by a poor attempt to a clearance allowed Sion Morgan a clear sight at goal and he smashed the ball home to give Bont the lead on 20 minutes.

Llan's misery was doubled as Bont netted a second only minutes later. A wicked cross was whipped in by Bont winger Celt Iwan, Llan's 16 year old custodian, Ben Tate, came out for it only to misjudge the flight of the ball and Alun Gwilym Williams netted his first goal from only 5 yards on 22 minutes.

It would have been easy for Llan to resort to different tactics and to panic at this point, but they plugged away with their passing game. Terry Watkinson and Aaron Griffiths were having joy against the Bont full-backs and both combined with Aaron Hughes on 29 minutes. A well worked move down the left flank between Aaron Hughes and Aaron Griffiths allowed Hughes to deliver a pin point cross for Terry Watkinson to head home his first competitive goal for the club.

Llan were back in the game, but Alun Gwilym Williams had other ideas and restored Bont's two goal advantage on 33 minutes. Williams capitalised on some confusion between the Llan back line and the keeper to sneak in and grab his second of the match and take Bont into the interval up by 3 goals to 1.

The mood in the Llan dressing room was slightly surprising as Craig Thomas delivered his half-time speech in a calm and positive manner. There was no panic within the Llan ranks, they had played well during the first 45 and only individual mistakes had seen them go into the interval behind. With that, Llan went out for the second half full of confidence in their own ability and the tactics provided by the manager.

Llan picked up the pace early in the second half, and played some excellent football. Man of the Match Celfyn Roberts finished off an excellent move by Llan which involved about 10 passes. The move finished with the returning Gavin Owen linking up with Terry Watkinson who played the ball towards Aaron Hughes who in turn pulled the ball back to the outstanding Roberts on the edge of the box to rifle the ball hard and low for his first goal in Llan colours on 51 minutes.

Clearly on top, Llan were back on level terms on 55 minutes when Scott Hughes drove into the Bont box from his midfield position to convert a Cynan Davies cross with an excellent powerful header (yes header!) from 15 yards out. Buoyed by their ability to haul back a two goal deficit, Llan pressed on and were rewarded with a fourth goal. Leading scorer Aaron Hughes finished off another excellent move to slot home his customary goal after some good work by full back Gavin Owen on 72 minutes.

Alun Gwilym Williams then completed his hat-trick on 75 minutes with a brilliant strike from the edge of the box to get Bont back on level terms. This would have knocked the confidence out of many teams, but not this Llan side. Not panicking, they kept to their passing style and were duly rewarded when Aaron Griffiths provided Aaron Hughes with a chance on 78 minutes. The marksman picked his spot and drilled home his seventh goal of

the season.

Llan created further chances with Terry Watkinson making the Bont keeper stretch to keep out his effort and Celfyn Roberts hitting the post. Despite being in control, Llan gave away a needless free-kick 20 yards away from goal. Gareth "Bych" Griffiths stepped up and hit an excellent free-kick which was flying into the top corner only for Ben Tate to make up for his earlier mistake with a superb diving save to his right. Celt Iwan was bearing down on the loose ball only for Tate to get up in the nick of time to clear the ball away. Bont's cries for a penalty were in vain as the home custodian clearly played the ball. It must be said that given Tate's shaky first half, his attitude and composure in the second was commendable. He played with confidence and assertiveness. People who understand the game know that goalkeepers of all ages make mistakes, but the way that Tate, given that he is only 16, composed himself and got back to his usual game must be applauded.

Soon after, the match referee Dewi Morris blew the full time whistle and Llan gained their first win of the league campaign. To come from behind in any match is always a tough ask, but to do it with the style of play Llan did last night was much-admired. Not at one point did Llan panic, they continued to play football the way it should be, full of movement and great passing and were duly rewarded for their efforts with three huge points that every player in the Llan squad must be proud of.

Llanystumdwy vs Llanllfyni (Cynghrrair/League 23/08/11)

Defeat in Season Opener by Kev Sheret

Llan kicked off their league campaign with a very disappointing 2-1 loss at the hands of league leaders Llanystumdwy. It was not so much the defeat that was disappointing but the manner in which it came. Llan were never in the game, and settled to trying to contain Llanystumdwy's long ball tactics in what turned out to be a very poor football match.

Llan were suffered a blow only minutes before kick-off when in-form Gavin Owen broke down during the warm-up. A quick change in personnel seemed to unsettle the team but all in all the first half was a particularly drab affair, with no real opportunities for either side. Llan could not get into their normal passing game as the energetic Llanystumdwy midfield pressurised the visitors at every opportunity.

The second half continued in the sluggish manner the first half finished for the visitors. Missed passes, miss controls and plain laziness on the part of some players were clear to see. Llanystumdwy persisted with their long ball tactics of the first half and won a corner. Carl Threadgill whipped in the corner, the Llan defence switched off, and veteran goal poacher Meirion Pritchard was left with an unchallenged header at the back post in which he duly powerfully finished. The lack of marking is something you might get away with in the Caernarfon & District but with finishers of the quality of Pritchard in the Gwynedd League you will be punished.

Hopes of going a goal down spurring Llan on were merely that, hopes. The visitor's misery was compounded on 72 minutes as Carl Threadgill was allowed to turn onto his left foot inside the box and drilled a sweet strike in off the Kev Sheret's far post. Credit must be given to the quality of the finish, but Llan's management team must feel aggrieved at the space he was allowed to have.

Pushing forward Llan were again vulnerable to Llanystumdwy's long ball as Idan Williams found himself one on one with Kev Sheret in the Llan goal only for the custodian to produce a good save down to his right. This spurred Llan on as they finally began to assert their passing game onto the match and scored in the 81st minute. Iwan Jones combined with substitute Aaron Griffiths and placed his 25 yard drive into the Llanystumdwy top corner.

The conclusion of the game followed the same pattern as the rest of the game with Llan unable to produce any clear cut chances. Aaron Hughes was put through on goal by Scott Hughes but couldn't get the ball out of his feet quick enough to get his shot away in time. Terry Watkinson then crossed into the box and Scott Hughes leapt between the two Llanystumdwy centre half's only to head wide from 8 yards out.

Llan's miserable evening was topped off with a second yellow card for Lee Hughes for questioning referee Paul Jones's decision not to give him a clear free-kick. The referee had no option than to produce the centre half's second yellow of the game. Players should know better than to question referees decisions.

The referee blew for full time much to the celebration of the Llanystumdwy bench. After the match Llan were quite rightly read the riot act by manager Craig Thomas in the away dressing room. The performance on Saturday must improve ten fold and given that a lot of Llan's young side have never tasted a league defeat before it will be interesting to see the team's reaction. However, Llan must approach the match on Saturday with confidence in their own ability and play to their own strengths from the first minute until last.
