Good afternoon everyone and welcome to Cow Lane for today's National Three fixture against Bracknell. We wish their players, staff, officials supporters a pleasant afternoon, along with those who have travelled from Enfield.

You will excuse us if we dedicate the rest of this programme to Malcolm Rose, player, team secretary, club fixture secretary and Tring Ranger, who sadly passed away this week after his brave battle against cancer. Malcolm had been an active member at Tring for most of his life and his passing will leave a big gap in the heart of the club.

To elaborate on Malcolm's many roles in the club over the years we asked 2nd XV manager Derek Trusselle to provide some background to Malcolm's long service.

"I first played with Malcolm at Tring in the colts. He played at No.8 and was an immensely strong runner. Along with the likes of Steve Kempster, Tim Campbell, Simon Mead and Geoff Bloomfield we were part of the first Tring Colts tour to Amsterdam.

Malcolm went on to play at 8 for the First XV and was an excellent try poacher from the back of the scrum and his incredibly strong upper body strength made him a formidable mauler, winning more than his fair share of turn-over ball for his team. In later years he moved up to join the Front Row Union but was an excellent utility forward and would happily fill in to help in the second row whenever asked.

Malcolm went on a number of Tring's famous cultural tours to France and Italy, where his opera singing skills came to the fore, indeed Malcolm's other great joy was being a member of the Vale of Aylesbury Gilbert & Sullivan society and took the lead role on a number of occasions.

As well as his playing skills Malcolm was team secretary for many seasons. In those days it was Malcolm's role, after selection, to phone around and inform players of their selection – all very time consuming in an era before mobile phones and email!

Most famously Malcolm took on the role of club fixture secretary and applied himself with

absolute dedication to the task for over 20 years. He never wanted to leave any Tring team without a fixture, sometimes working hard on the morning of the match to secure an opponent. No coach ever liked having to tell Malcolm that we were having to cry-off a fixture ourselves! As well as the opponents, Malcolm would make sure that referees were appointed and confirmed and that the necessary club officials from our opponents were duly invited to dine with us at VP lunches – it was a non-stop role, week in, week out, throughout the season and integral to the running of the club.

An infectious and instantly recognisable laugh and a love of good food are probably most people's favourite memories of Malcolm. When Tring played away games Malcolm would immediately inform us whether the post-match tea would be any good – he was always happy to play away if the tea was going to be up to scratch!

Away from Tring Malcolm was a passionate supporter of Wasps and England but he was a true club man and immensely proud to see his son Chris force his way up from the 4's a couple of years ago to become a first-team regular. Like father like son in the way they both play and enjoy the game in a no-holds barred way."

We will all have stories and memories of Malcolm to cherish and share and a book of condolence has been placed in the clubhouse for people to sign.

Our thoughts, prayers and best wishes are with Gill, Chris and Katie at this time. Details of the funeral arrangements will be posted on the website in due course.

All today's games will be preceded by a minutes silence in memory of Malcolm after which your usual level of support, also in memory of Malcolm, will be most welcome. Please make the most of the afternoon and raise a glass or two in memory of Malcolm and our other absent friends.
