WRFC WINS £50,000 FROM SPORT ENGLAND!!

Sport England has agreed to fund the 3-year programme of improvements to our pitches and training areas up to a maximum of £50,000. This follows the pilot exercise on the 3rd Team pitch this summer, funded by members through the club's Pitch Rescue Appeal.

Sport England is one of the bodies that distributes lottery money, and this award is made in the first round of a new funding stream entitled "Places People Play", which SE describes as "a programme to deliver a London Olympic and Paralympic legacy of increased mass participation in sport". WRFC was one of only two rugby clubs in the south to apply in the new funding stream's first round, and both applications were successful.

A condition of Sport England's offer is that we provide "partnership funding", in cash and in kind – the latter in the form of volunteer labour – worth at least as much as their award. So please keep the donations to the Pitch Rescue Appeal rolling in! Every penny will be well spent.

We will now start discussions with Sport England's consultant agronomists to define the precise detail of what is to be done, when and at what cost, over the coming three years. Probably the first thing members will notice will be shallow trenches dug between the pitches early next spring as contractors install a new system to pump water to the newly-seeded pitches and training areas.

Donations to the Pitch Rescue Fund can be made via the Club's website, by post or in the clubhouse. For every £20 you donate, you "buy" a square on the aerial photograph of the pitches displayed on the main bar, and if you have signed a Gift Aid declaration your £20 gets the club £25.

WINCHESTER WIN OUT IN AN ENTERTAINING CONTEST



Winchester made the long trip to Ashford in Kent for the first round of the RFU Senior Vase on Saturday. They came away with a 26 – 22 victory, their fifth in a row, in a hugely entertaining contest. Winchester were somewhat depleted due to injuries and unavailability though this gave coach Andy Fields a good chance to see players such as Alex Jack, Josh Cutteridge and Spencer Edwards who have been impressing in the 2nd team.

Winchester kicked off on Ashford's magnificent new, wide pitch. On a beautiful autumn day everything seemed set fair for a feast of running rugby and the match certainly didn't disappoint. Winchester took control early moving the ball through multiple phases and setting their big forward runners at the Ashford defence. Time and time again the gain line was crossed but Ashford regrouped and reorganised and kept Winchester at bay. Winchester's pressure eventually told when a perfect catch and drive from a lineout splintered the Ashford pack and prop Danny Waite crashed over for his second try of the season. 20-year-old Spencer Edwards, playing his first ever first-team game in the unfamiliar position of fly half, coolly converted.

Ashford then began to show their attacking intent. Prepared to run the ball from almost anywhere and unafraid to use the width of the pitch they began to seriously test Winchester's back three who were playing together for the first time. Right wing Alex Jack and debutant full-

back Josh Cutteridge did well and showed their willingness to get involved in the physical side of the game. Ashford's excellent fly half kicked a penalty to pull the score back to 7 - 3.

Winchester continued to look good with ball in hand and soon extended their lead. Veteran utility back Matt Woods, playing at inside centre this week, scored a fine individual try when he broke free in his own half. He somehow spun his way out of despairing tackles and kept his stumpy legs going until he scored under the Ashford posts. Spencer Edwards converted for a 14 -3 lead that Winchester took into half-time.

Winchester started the second half superbly. Adam Adkins had replaced Ben Gardner at scrum-half and was buzzing about effectively. Ignoring the three men outside him he finished off a superb solo effort with another try close to the posts. Spencer Edwards once more converted and Winchester looked comfortable at 21 - 3.

Ashford however refused to fold. They continued to move the ball and constantly tested Winchester's defence. On one sweeping move Alex Jack was forced to step in and unfortunately hit the Ashford winger late and high. He was lucky to escape with only a yellow card and 10 min in the sin bin. Ashford then came right back at Winchester. They made the most of Jack's absence when they moved the ball smartly down the left-hand side of the pitch for a superb try in the corner. Their tails were up and they seem determined to make a game of it.

Winchester then extended their lead to 26 – 8 when quick thinking and good hands put their excellent winger Matt Burt in for his sixth try of the season. Instead of giving up and rolling over, Ashford came right back at Winchester. Once more they moved the ball smartly to the left wing where Winchester were undermanned. Once more they scored a superb try in the left corner to bring the score back to 26 – 13. Their fly half kicked the tricky conversion from the touchline for 26 – 15.

Ashford now believed they could win the game and soon scored again, this time in the right hand corner. Once more the fly half converted to bring the score back to 26 – 22. Winchester now faced a torrid 7 minutes to see if they could hang on for the victory.

Winchester are a more resilient side than in past seasons. Despite a few scares they managed to hang on for the victory. Credit must go to Ashford for the way they stuck to their principles and continuously tried to stretch Winchester out wide. Any neutral watching the game would have thoroughly enjoyed such an enterprising game. Winchester coach Andy Fields didn't enjoy it quite so much but heaped credit on his players for the way they stuck at their task. They have created an excellent environment for men's rugby in Winchester and should be proud of their efforts.

HEROIC COLTS VICTORY IN NATIONAL CUP

It was a defining moment for this year's Colts team. A combination of commitment, team spirit and adrenaline saw the team achieve an epic victory.

It was by any measure an extraordinary performance by the Colts. Down to 16 men in the first quarter they had no room for manoeuvre. Every player had to commit all they had and keep running long after normal energy reserves had been depleted. And with Havant camped on the Winchester line in the last 10 minutes it took massive effort to put in tackle after tackle to defend the line. It was a show of enormous team spirit.

The injury problems started early, with two players dropping out before the game and two more failing to get through the warm up. The squad remained undaunted and made a good start to the match. Winchester's early focus has been poor this season and a more structured pre-match warm up paid real dividends when the team came out of the blocks faster and sharper than previous matches.

The teams were evenly matched with both sides running the ball well and managing set pieces effectively. Winchester looked strong down the central channels while Havant looked dangerous out wide with missed final passes saving Winchester on one or two occasions. Sadly centre Tom Powell was off within 10 minutes with a twisted knee and fly half Alex Cornford followed shortly after with a pulled thigh muscle. The team restructured around a new back line under some intense pressure from Havant. A kick over the Winchester defence was chased by both Havant and Winchester wingers and an unlucky bounce saw the ball in Havant hands for an easy touch down.

Winchester were on the back foot and it took some enormous defence by the forwards to keep Havant at bay, but the game swung in Winchester's favour and in a Bull brothers special Ben Bull drove long hard yards up pitch not once but twice, and the ball then sped from the back of the ruck to brother Harry who dived between the posts to score. Rhodri Adamson took an easy conversion.

Half time score 7-5 to Winchester.

The second half started with some fantastic pressure from Winchester who had 80% of the ball in the third quarter. The forwards had a huge impact, the front row winning an epic battle in the scrum, second row pairing Fergus Bailey and Will Buckland immense in their aggressive ball carrying, and the back row scavenging the ball with great running off the back of the rucks. The backs played their part with quick handling and strong direct running. But Winchester failed to convert pressure to points with 3 penalties not making touch and handling errors just short of line.

Having been pinned in their half Havant broke out with 10 minutes to go. It was a make or break for Winchester. The players must have been exhausted but they made tackle after tackle and the speed off the defence line was extraordinary after such a gruelling match. Time and again Winchester repelled Havant slowly pushing them backward. But it seemed inevitable that finally a penalty was conceded. Fortunately it was a long distance shot which Havant just missed.

Winchester broke out of their half with only minutes to go and managed to contain the game in midfield until Rhodri Adamson could kick the ball dead to finish the game.

In the heat of the moment technical skills may not have been their best, but this was one of the colt's outstanding performances of the last few seasons. There couldn't have been greater commitment from any player.

Winchester will now take on Worthing in the next round of the National Cup.

WINCHESTER U14s SEND JERSEY PACKING

The sun shone on a beautiful morning at Winchester and after our leader Gareth had wiped away the tears of disappointment from yesterday's semi-final defeat for Wales at the hands of the referee, he started the day with a Churchillian style team talk to fire up the team.

The team certainly appeared to need it. I'm not sure what they feed them on the island (mushroom compost?) but it certainly gets them growing. It worked wonders with Winchester really taking the game to Jersey, winning several turn-overs at the breakdown and shading the early exchanges with **Eddie** particularly prominent with some barnstorming runs. But for a few dropped early passes, Winchester would have gone over earlier, however after 16 minutes, following rucks on both sides of the pitch and some great interplay between forwards and backs, **Josh Moore** took a pass from **Will Harvey** and forced his way over from 15 yards (although in the car on the way home he was sure it was closer to 80 yards, he's certainly inherited his father's modesty!). A quick check with the video ref (aka **Simon Arthur**) seemed to indicate that he hadn't quite made it (however as far as Simon is concerned, Josh is yet to score a try in Rugby!). **Lloyd (Paddy) Jones** made a great attempt to land the conversion but missed from the touchline. The try certainly seemed to fire up Jersey who dominated the remainder of the first half and but for some valiant tackling particularly from the backs, much of it only yards from the Winchester line, and some dogged rucking and mauling, and some great clearing kicks from Paddy, Winchester held out until half time.

The second half started where the first ended, with Jersey dominating the territory, but again Winchester held firm and were not giving an inch, with several crucial turnovers at the breakdown and the pack competing for everything. A Jersey penalty was missed, but they seemed to have finally managed to breach the Winchester defences creating a 3 to 1 overlap in the corner, but a brilliant tackle from Harry Johnson (combined with a decision from the Jersey player not to pass that would keep you awake at night!) meant that once again Winchester held them out. From the restart **Will Harvey** managed to break 3 tackles on his own line to get to the 22 and this created a great passage of play for Winchester. This resulted in **Will Harvey** finishing what he had started by going over in the corner, literally running over the final defender to get to the line. Lucky he could still see the line with the shiner he had acquired in the first half. **Paddy** didn't have time to thank his teammates for leaving him another impossible kick from the touchline before seeing his kick come back of the crossbar. Great kick but very unlucky. Winchester then held out reasonably comfortably for the last ten minutes with Jersey struggling to get over the killer blow. Overall a fantastic start to the season against a very good Jersey team.

BBC 1’s “Dirty Tricks of the Tradesmen”, hosted by Chris Hollins and Roger Bisby, is the audacious new hidden camera documentary series for BBC ONE. It aims to show viewers how to protect their homes against the cowboy builders who target them every day, by sending an acting “rogue tradesman” into people’s homes to try to rip them off using well-known con tricks.

Our money has to work even harder for us these days, and one of our biggest expenditures is on our property. According to the Office of National Statistics, in 2010 we spent a staggering £15 billion pounds on repairs to our homes. Since most of us know very little about plumbing, electrics, roofing and glazing, we put our trust in tradesmen and expect them to play fair. Of course, the vast majority are fair. It’s a small minority who become cowboys in search of a fast buck, but they can still make life a misery for thousands of us each year.

With more than forty years of experience under his builder’s belt, Roger Bisby disapproves of the tricksters who sometimes give his profession a bad name. He will go against everything he believes in and become the rogue tradesman on camera.

This is the show that protects viewers from unscrupulous tradesmen and arms them with the knowledge to spot those dirty tricks. Funny, fast-moving and often shocking, viewers will see the scams unfold. In both the hidden camera stunts and the true stories, the emphasis is very much on showing us all how to stop ourselves from being ripped off and to prove that crime doesn’t pay.
