## WINCHESTER DROP TO THIRD

Winchester's seven-game league winning streak came to an end with a 28 – 17 loss on Saturday to a powerful Old Alleynians side. Winchester made the long trip to Dulwich in high spirits following last week's victory against league leaders Sandown and Shanklin. There was one change in the side with veteran utility back Matt Woods moving to the centre to replace the unavailable Dom Wade. Exciting young prospect Josh Cutteridge returned on the right wing.

Winchester began by failing to put the kick-off the required 10 m. This immediately gave Alleynians the chance to establish field position and they clearly looked an efficient, well-organised side. Winchester then produced some of their best rugby of the season. For a 10 min period they drove powerfully into the heart of the Alleynians defence with the forwards producing quick ball for the backs to play with. Eventually fly half Simon Fountain crashed over from close range for an excellent team try. Matt Gibson failed with the conversion for a 5 – 0 lead.



Winchester came close again when hard-working second row Adam Grant knocked on close to the try line. Alleynians were able to clear their lines. A needless penalty then gave them the opportunity to kick deep into Winchester's 22. A well-executed catch and drive and some poor ruck defence gave them a soft try which their fly half Jamie Docherty converted for a 7 – 5 lead.



The balance of the game now started to swing in the home sides favour. Winchester's lineout was not functioning and they were unable to get their hands on the ball. Unnecessary penalties and flustered decision-making hampered Winchester's play and invited constant pressure. Docherty converted another penalty to extend the lead to 10 – 5 where it remained until half-time.

Influential loose head Danny Waite had to be replaced at half-time due to a clash of heads. Campbell Ettinger moved into the front row and Matt Lown replaced him at lock. Winchester looked tense despite clearly being in the game. Alleynians were able to capitalise on this by playing some smart and efficient rugby. Winchester's defence, which has been excellent of late, was breached far too easily. Alleynians extended their lead with a further three tries. Winchester continued to fight to the end with tight head prop Stuart Moreton outstanding despite a number of gashes to his head. Fly half Simon Fountain bundled over for his second and replacement flanker Richard Knight scored at the death to bring some respectability to the score line. The game finished 28 – 17 in Alleynians favour who leap frogged Winchester into second place in London South West 3.



Winchester head coach Andy Fields was disappointed though not downhearted. At times his players put together some excellent passages of rugby and went down to a very good side. 'There is a long hard season ahead of us' he said. 'We have to learn to put days like this behind us and move on to thinking about our next league game against Weybridge. We have come a long way as a club and it's important that we learn from days like today and always strive to improve.'

## **WINCHESTER 2ND XV EXTEND WINNING STREAK TO 8 GAMES**

**On a sunny and mild day at North Walls Park, Winchester 2nd XV faced 3rd placed U.S Portsmouth. The game was going to be a battle from the start and Winchester 2nd XV had a point to prove from last year.**

The home side won the toss and chose to play not facing into the sun for the first period. After a great Kick Off kicked by Fly Half Tom Locke, U.S Portsmouth found themselves on the back foot from the first minute of the game seeing Back Row Jim Trantham and Tom Self making the opening tackles. The game started at a high tempo and Winchester were breaking the game line through the centres and by using the back three but failed to finish due to minor team errors.

As the game continued Winchester had their first opportunity to get on the score board, unfortunately due to a ball falling off the kicking tee this opportunity was floored. From the 22 drop out U.S Portsmouth kicked long putting Winchester's back three under pressure and US gained a kickable penalty due to Winchester not releasing the ball on the floor at the break down. This took the score to 3-0 to the visitors.

After a quick chat under the home teams posts Winchester re organised and came flying back. Winchester had a 5m lineout on the oppositions try line, with great throwing by hooker Chris Hancock and jumping by number 8 Will Self which allowed the forwards to push over the line for the opening try of the game. Liam King (2nd Row Place Kicker) allowed Winchester to gain the conversion points which took the score to 8-3 to the home side.

After receiving the kick from the away side Winchester were playing their patterns with pace and aggression. The game was flowing seeing great hands out wide and it wasn't long before influential Steve Dachtler scored his first try of the game taking the home side 5 points further ahead.

After the interval U.S Portsmouth were attacking well but this was broken due to the strength in Winchester's well organised defence. Both sides battled up front both in the rucks and mauls as well as in the scrums and lineouts.

Winchester were defending well until a gap appeared behind the breakdown allowing U.S Portsmouth's centre to run in a try from the half way line. Winchester came back and finished the game seeing tries from Charlie Stringer and centre Jerry Alfandari. Liam King also helped Winchester 2nd XV gather up those conversion points.

A special mention to back row replacement Damian Shacknell who was seriously injured during the game after only being on the pitch for a couple of minutes. Our thoughts are with him and hope he will recover as quickly as possible.

After the game Captain Mark Castle said "it was a great performance and we played the game how we wanted to play." He also said "the team's confidence is growing and this is really showing in their performances".

Winchester 2nd XV look forward to playing Havant 3rds in two weeks time and hope to continue their un-beaten status as they want to remain at the top of the league.

The forwards were winning good ball at the break downs, the ball was moving well across field, the only downside was an occasional lack of support running, leaving players isolated. Slowly but surely spaces started to open up in the Worthing defence. As the game hit the 25th minute Winchester scored a well worked try. Number 8 Chris Keegan leading the charge forward, the forwards pulling in the defence and the ball spinning to lock Will Buckland who ran an acute angle from the 22 over the try line. Alex Cornford converted.



Disappointingly as the half closed the team leaked a try, when Worthing camped on the Winchester try line and eventually drove over. A loose penalty meant the team went into the interval 7-8 down.

The third quarter saw Winchester pull ahead after only 30 seconds, with a penalty kick taken by Cornford. The team were creating space all over the pitch, break after break saw the team repeatedly attacking the Worthing try line – but Winchester were just unable to convert the pressure into points – falling short of the try line by inches on two occasions.

As the game entered the final quarter the momentum flowed Worthing's way, with Winchester noticeably tiring. In quick succession the Worthing forwards drove a maul over the line and then their centre made a strong attacking run to cut through a number of players to score. In the final moments scrum half James Falconer got some points on the board with a final drop goal. It was a good committed performance from a Colts team that is developing well and is really starting to gel. Shame the game just slipped away in the final quarter! Final score 13-23.
