Disciplinary protocol

- 1 All reports of misconduct received in the two partner leagues will be dealt with in accordance with this protocol. All disciplinary processes followed in both league will comply with the [ECB discipline regulations and guidelines](#), in particular, the guidelines on the conduct of hearings and appeals.
- 2 All misconduct issues arising at games played under the auspices of the Yorkshire South Premier League will be dealt with under the direction of the YSPL disciplinary sub-committee.
- 3 All misconduct issues arising at games played under the auspices of the South Yorkshire Senior Cricket League will be dealt with under the direction of the SYSCCL disciplinary chairman.
- 4 All misconduct issues arising at games played by YSPL and SYSCCL clubs in competitions not under the jurisdiction of the YSPL and SYSCCL, will be dealt with as directed by the organiser of the relevant competition. If either the YSPL or SYSCCL are requested to deal with an issue, it will be dealt with in accordance with this protocol.
- 5 All misconduct issues arising at other than at games, for example, through social media or other forms of communication, will initially be dealt with by the club with whom the player is registered. If this action is unacceptable, a decision will be made jointly by the YSPL and SYSCCL in respect of further action.
- 6 If the offender is not a player, or if there is any other question about which league should deal with a misconduct report, this will be decided by the YSPL chairman and SYSCCL cricket chairman.
- 7 Once a misconduct report has been dealt with in accordance with this protocol, it shall not be dealt with again in any forum, save for any appeal arising from the original hearing.
- 8 Disciplinary sanctions imposed under, or endorsed under, this protocol, will be observed and respected by both leagues.
