AGM 2/16	<p>Luke Swanson Chief Executive Officer from Chance to Shine gave a presentation regarding the 2016 Blue Bails Day.</p> <p>Feedback from the 2015 scheme in general was positive, but there was some feeling that the scheme was slightly rushed, taking this into account, the 2016 Blue Bails Day will run on 13th August 2016 on the third day of the Oval Test against Pakistan. An online pack will be distributed upon sign up, and a hard pack of advertising materials will be distributed at the league's ball's distribution day.</p> <p>Bails and further merchandise will be distributed by Cricket United in the lead up to the event on 13th August.</p> <p>Registration to be completed via the Surrey Championship website.</p> <p>The President encouraged clubs to sign up in 2016 and it is hoped that there will be an increase in clubs participating (25 in 2015). MB / HR to distribute presentation, and this will be added to the league website.</p>	MB / HR

AGM 3/16	<p>The Chairman noted that there is wide a range of issues on the agenda. He is aware that there a number of other issues which wouldn't be visited at today's meeting, including start times and bonus points. The Executive will continue to discuss, monitor and investigate these issues throughout the season.</p> <p>The Chairman reported that the bonus points system will continue into a second season and will be monitored / reviewed at the end of the 2016 season.</p> <p>The Chairman thanked the executive for their hard work, but felt that the way their work is organised requires a stronger emphasis on cricket.</p>

	Treasurer's Report	
AGM 7/16	<p>A. Financial Report 2015 and Budget 2016 – CLC reported that the league made a marginal loss of £680 in 2015; this is the result of a significantly reduced fines income and reduced interest levels following the maturity of a previous investment in 2015. Costs have been reduced considerably over the past year to minimize the loss. CLC is troubled with the amount of fines given to clubs (£4000 worth), and would like to see a reduction, although he noted the greater flexibility shown by the executive than in previous years. CLC reported that it is proposed to keep the current subscription levels in 2016, with a small 50p rise per ticket cost for the annual dinner, along with a small increase in the price of balls, due to a price rise from Readers. Hampton Wick Royal proposed the adoption of the accounts, seconded by Byfleet.</p> <p>B. Sponsorship – CLC reported that a sponsorship deal has been agreed in principal. The Chairman noted that an announcement will be made shortly once the sponsorship deal has been finalised. A consequence of the deal will be that fees will be maintained as of previous years. The Chairman thanked CLC and RW for leading the negotiations on behalf of the league, as well as Surrey CCC for their help with negotiations.</p>	
	Changes in Rules and Playing Conditions Proposed by the Executive	
AGM 8/16	<p>A. Proposed Changes to Playing Conditions</p> <p>See Proposed changes document (Appendix A) for rule change details</p> <p>Comments:</p> <p>Timed Games – minor changes to wording, the substantive change is that the number of overs which constitutes a weather-curtailed match is proposed to be changed to 10 overs from 20 overs. The Chairman noted that the 'get the game on' initiative urges that RPC's should allow for games to produce results where possible. AG noted that the proposed regulation would affect shorter format games significantly. Haslemere noted that going from 20 overs to ten seemed slightly excessive. Various clubs felt that there had been inadequate opportunity to discuss the proposal at an earlier stage. The Chairman said that in the light of the comments he would not seek a vote and the Executive would consider whether to bring the proposal back for renewed discussion at the Council meeting in October.</p> <p>Overseas Players Regulations: RL reported that the ECB have encouraged the league to align with the ECB regulations which depends on a player's residency in the United Kingdom, rather than the passport held. The League has consulted with the ECB and the rules proposed have been drafted between the two organisations. The Chairman reported that the league have very much followed the rules applying to the ECB's own competitions.</p> <p>RL reported that the league has been asked by Surrey CCC to accommodate a small number of players put forward by the county club who have the right to work in the United Kingdom, have formally declared their intention to qualify to play for England, and who would be looking to play a high standard of club cricket when available. RL proposed to put together a set of guidelines which will provide a</p>	

	<p>workable interim solution for the 2016 season, on which a decision about full incorporation into league playing conditions could be made prior to the 2017 season. These would be shared with Premier Division and Division 1 clubs as soon as possible.</p> <p>RL noted that there are separate conditions for overseas players for those clubs not in Tier One.</p> <p>RL clarified that lower division clubs are allowed to register one overseas player per club. RL noted that the league believe strongly that there shouldn't be an increase in the numbers of overseas players permitted at each club.</p> <p>The chairman noted that the proposal is to be put for vote in 2017.</p> <p>AG noted that a person's passport is irrelevant in the new regulations, with the applicant's residency being the key factor in deciding eligibility.</p> <p>Clubs are encouraged to contact Anthony Gamble (Registration Secretary) if they have any registration queries.</p>																													
	3rd Eleven Cricket (Changes to Divisional Structure)																													
AGM 9/16	<p>The Chairman reported that a meeting has been held with clubs directly affected by the changes to regional 3rd eleven cricket. He reported that the Surrey Championship Regional leagues will merge with the Fullers third eleven league, to operate jointly under the Surrey Championship and Fullers league in 2016. In division two of the Championship third eleven league three clubs would be relegated should the structure remain in place in 2017. The Chairman noted that all playing condition regulations for the new structure will be conveyed to clubs once confirmed.</p>

AGM 11/16	<p>A. Balls and Year Books – 20th April 2016 – Venue: Wimbledon CC – BD proposed to bring this forward to 13th April 2016. BD will notify clubs if this is to be brought forward.</p> <p>B. Annual Dinner – 7th October 2016 – Venue: Kia Oval – RW announced that Tony Cottee, the former Glamorgan cricketer, has been confirmed to speak at the 2016 dinner.</p> <p>RW noted that 2018 is the league's 50 year anniversary. RW is currently compiling a project team to organise celebrations for the anniversary and invites members to get in touch with him should they wish to be part of this team.</p> <p>C. Council Meeting – 17th October 2016 – Venue: Wimbledon CC</p>	All

AGM 12/16	<p>a) Surrey Championship T20 competition – Will run in 2016, further details to follow.</p> <p>b) Ryman Surrey Championship Facilities Grant 2016 – The Chairman reported that the facilities grant will run again, dependent on sponsorship being received, and information about this grant will be distributed once confirmed. GJ noted that the 2015 grant scheme was undersubscribed and hoped that there would be better take up by clubs for the 2016 fund.</p> <p>c) Ryman Surrey Championship Umpire Training Grants 2016 – JYB reported that the Surrey Championship reimburse training course fees for umpires, as long as they umpire at least three league games during the season. He noted that the last available training course starts on Sunday 31st January 2016, with details of this course found on the website. Clubs are encouraged to send suitable candidates onto this course.</p> <p>Hampton Wick Royal enquired whether start times are to be clarified. The Chairman will send out an explanation as to why start times differ between first and second elevens. The Chairman noted that opinion on Start times will be continue to be monitored, and if there is a reasonable opinion that change is needed this issue will be revisited as required. It was asked if flexibility could be given to clubs to organise start times between themselves. The Chairman said that all ideas can be considered but common start times are a well-established principle of league cricket.</p> <p>When will the fixtures be released? The Chairman reported that the fixtures are ready to be released. The Chairman noted that there is an ever increasing list of special requests which along with the changes in third eleven structure has delayed the production of the fixtures, going forward the level of special requests will need to be monitored to ensure the smooth production of a structured set of fixtures.</p> <p>RL reported that the Executive have been requested to accommodate a small number of exempt overseas players by some clubs and by Surrey County Cricket Club. The Executive feel the best way to accommodate these would be to establish a proposal which will provide for these players in 2016. The Chairman but believes that the league should provide players recommended by Surrey CC with the opportunity to play high class cricket at a weekend should they be available. The proposal is that these players could be from any first class county.</p> <p>PT reported that Small Grants applications are to be reviewed during the week, with communications being sent out to clubs after this. £100,000 will be distributed across the county. He reported that basic affiliation to the Surrey Cricket</p>	

	<p>Foundation is paid for via the league and clubs can sign up for additional benefits using the Friends of Surrey Cricket Affiliation package which can be accessed on the Surrey Cricket Foundation website, at an additional cost of £150.</p> <p>The Surrey Cricket Foundation Club Conference is being held on Sunday 20th March 2016 at the Kia Oval. Clubs are encouraged to sign up via the Surrey Cricket Foundation website.</p>

Appendix A Proposed changes to the Surrey Championship Constitution

Note that Text in **RED** are the amendments to the existing rules and playing conditions

To Amend PC5 (a) of The Constitution

Insert new wording "The results of these matches played in the Championship shall be tabled in league form on the following points basis (including the provision of bonus points under the provisions of PC5 (c))"

In PC5 (a) under the bullet points amend as follows

- Win – 24 points
- Lose – no points
- Tie – 12 points **to each side**

In a drawn game where the side batting second has received a minimum of 10 overs (the scoring rate is to be determined by dividing the number of runs scored by the legitimate number of balls received)

- For the side with the faster scoring rate, 2 points
- For the side with the slower scoring rate, **no points** will be awarded
- Where both sides have an identical scoring rate, 1 point **will be awarded to each side**

If the AGM subsequently votes to amend the number of overs constituting a match to 10 overs then:

In addition to the above, an abandoned match is determined where the side batting second has not received Ten (10) overs. In this case, 4 points only will be awarded to each side

Note - If the AGM subsequently votes NOT to amend the number of overs constituting a match to 10 overs then this sentence will remain as is and no changes will be made to the playing conditions in each tier.

Note – appropriate changes to the Playing Conditions in each Tier will be made if the AGM votes in favour of 10 overs constituting a match.

To Amend PC5 (b) of The Constitution

The results of these matches played in the Championship shall be tabled in league form on the following points basis (including the provision of bonus points under the provisions of PC5 (c))

In PC5 (b) under bullet points amend as follows

- Win 20 points
- Lose – no points
- Tie – 10 points to each side

In addition to the above, an abandoned match is determined where the side batting second has not received Ten (10) overs. In this case, 4 points only will be awarded to each side.

Note - If the AGM subsequently votes NOT to amend the number of overs constituting a match to 10 overs no changes will be made to the playing conditions in each tier.

Note – appropriate changes to the Playing Conditions in each Tier will be made if the AGM votes in favour of 10 overs constituting a match.

To be deferred to the 2016 Council Meeting

To Amend PC 1 (b) Tiers One and Two:

There will be an interval of 30 minutes between innings, although this may be varied at the discretion of and agreement of both the Umpires and Captains in the case of an interrupted match. If the innings of the team batting first is completed prior to the scheduled time for the interval, this interval of 30 minutes shall take place immediately and the innings of the team batting second will commence correspondingly earlier, providing that this does not lead to an interval occurring more than 40 minutes prior to the scheduled interval. If so the side batting second will commence their innings and tea will be taken at the scheduled time”.

General Amendment

To Amend the Constitution and any or all playing conditions with appropriate numbering of Rules and Playing Conditions for reference purposes only, if such current numbers change as a result of these proposed amendments.

Carried

To delete PC12 PC13 PC14 PC15 and PC16, of The Constitution, and replace with the following in it's entirety:

PC12 – REGISTRATION CATEGORIES OF PLAYERS

- (a) Each player that is required to be registered in the Premier and 1st Division of the 1st XI, as detailed herein, will be registered in one of the following Four categories:
- (1) Category 1 - **All players except those in categories 2 and 3.**
 - (2) Category 2 - Contracted Player - **See PC13** in its entirety.
 - (3) Category 3 – Overseas Player - **See PC14** in its entirety.
 - (4) Category 3E – Overseas Exempt player – See PC 14 in its entirety.

The definitions of each category has been determined by the ECB and are as follows:

Category 1.

A Player who is:

- i. A British or Irish citizen born in England and Wales **and or**
- ii. Has been Resident in England and Wales for the immediately preceding four consecutive years and is deemed Ordinarily Resident.

Note:

“Resident”:

A player will only be treated as having been resident within England and Wales for the relevant consecutive period if he has spent a minimum of 210 days in each year within England and Wales (for which purpose ‘year’ shall mean a year ending 31st March).

“Ordinarily Resident”:

A player will be treated as Ordinarily Resident if he has been resident in England and Wales for a minimum of 18 months before 31st March in the relevant year and he has not been out of England and Wales for longer than 35 days consecutively or 70 days in total during the previous two years.

Category 2.

A Full Contracted Player (“Full”) is:

A player who is at the time of registration, contracted to a First Class County Club or who is on the M.C.C. Groundstaff ("a Full Contracted Player").

A Home Contracted Player (Home”) is:

A current member of the club requesting registration and has been a member for at least two consecutive seasons prior to the current season in which registration is being requested **OR** has played at least 12 games within the last two prior seasons.

Category 3.

An Overseas Player (“Overseas”) is:

A player may be so defined as a player who is not Category 1 or Category 2 or Category 3e.

Category 3e.

An Overseas Exempt Player is:

Any player not qualified under Category 1 BUT is Ordinarily Resident within the meaning detailed above, and is not an Overseas Player or a Full or Home contracted

(b)	<p><u>Special Exceptions 1</u></p> <p>The following exceptions apply to Divisions 2 to 5 of the 1st XI inclusive:</p> <p>An Overseas Player who is intending to be registered and play for any XI other than a 1st XI Premier or 1st XI Division One side is so defined:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> I. <i>is not qualified to play for England under current ECB regulations as amended from time to time, and</i> II. <i>has spent the last English winter or part of it outside the United Kingdom.</i> <p><i>For the purposes of this rule:-</i></p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> III. <i>"last winter" means the winter immediately prior to the season in question running from the 1st October to the 30th April;</i> IV. <i>part of "the last winter" shall mean any period or periods totalling in excess of four weeks in the said period between 1st October and 30th April , and</i> V. <i>the definition of "ordinarily resident" shall be in the absolute discretion of the Executive who shall take into account among other factors whether the player has a home in this country, is in the country or is abroad temporarily or permanently, the length of any working contract abroad and nationality.</i>
PC13 – REGISTRATION PLAYING CONDITIONS	
(a)	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> I. A valid Surrey Championship Registration is a registration that has been applied for on the appropriate form of The Championship AND has been accepted by The Registration Secretary of The Championship II. A valid Play Cricket Registration is a registration that has been entered, by the player and or the club into the Play-cricket system AND has been accepted by The Registration Secretary of The Championship within the Play-Cricket system
(b)	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> I. All member clubs within The Championship must ensure that all players regardless of the XI that they will be playing in, will have a valid Play-Cricket registration established. II. Players requiring to be registered as detailed herein have additionally to establish a valid Surrey Championship registration. No player requiring to be registered may play unless such a registration exists. III. A valid registration does not exist until the Registration Secretary has confirmed to the club making the application that the registration has been completed. IV. No Club with a 1st XI in the 1st XI Premier Division or a the 1st XI Division 1 may play any player in its 1st XI unless that player has: <ol style="list-style-type: none"> a. A valid Surrey Championship Registration – see PC13 (a) b. A valid Play-Cricket Registration – see PC13 (a) V. In addition, no club with a 1st XI in any Championship Division may play an Overseas player an Exempt Overseas player or a Contracted Player, as defined herein in PC12, in any of its XIs unless that player has: <ol style="list-style-type: none"> a. A valid Surrey Championship Registration – see PC13 (b) b. A valid Play-Cricket Registration – see PC13 (b)

	<p>VI. Every registration application must define the category into which it is considered the player falls and may be refused if the Registration Secretary considers the player does not comply with the requirements of that category.</p> <p>VII. All such players as require to be registered and are known by a member club to be available to play in at least the first match of the Championship season, should apply to be registered on Play-Cricket and with the Championship, by 30th April each year. However, Any such players as require to be registered that are not registered on Play-Cricket or with the Championship, may be the subject of applications for both registrations before 9pm on the Wednesday before the first match that the player will play in, notwithstanding the Playing Conditions regarding the registration of overseas players.</p> <p>VIII. The lodging of applications by the time limits referred to in VII above does not guarantee that the player will be registered in time for the match following as the Registration Secretary may refuse the application or require further information or evidence. The acceptance of an application for registration must be confirmed by the Registration Secretary for the player to be eligible to play.</p> <p>IX. When the application to register has been entered by the player and or club into Play-Cricket, The Championship Registration Secretary will process the Play-Cricket registration request and advise the club of the registration application status, which is either accepted or refused.</p> <p>X. Only players with an accepted registration may play. Should any unregistered player play in a relevant championship match then R11(b) will apply.</p> <p>XI. For the purpose of this Playing Condition a playing member of a club in the Surrey County League shall be deemed to be playing Championship cricket. In the event that a club has a side in the Surrey County League then that player must be registered in accordance with these playing conditions.</p>
(c)	<p>I. Any player playing Saturday league cricket for a club outside of the Surrey Championship is not eligible to play on an occasional basis.</p> <p>II. However, any player who is currently at School or University or bonā fide Education establishment, and provides evidence to support this, may be registered on Play-Cricket for two Premier Leagues concurrently during their time at the said establishment; however, upon concluding their time at the said establishment, the player must de-register from one of the two Premier Leagues.</p>
(d)	<p>I. No player may play Championship cricket for more than one club in any season without the permission of the Executive.</p> <p>II. Any player who required to be registered under the provisions herein must be deregistered by the first club and reregistered by the second club before playing for the second club.</p> <p>III. For any player not requiring to be registered with the Championship the receiving club must apply to the Registration Secretary on the relevant transfer form</p> <p>IV. Providing the reregistration or transfer application is accepted, the player will be eligible to play for the new club three weeks after approval by the Championship Executive.</p> <p>V. For the purpose of this playing condition a playing member of a club in the Surrey County League shall be deemed to be playing Surrey Championship cricket.</p>
(e)	<p>I. No Member Club shall register more than one Overseas Player (Category 3) each year.</p>

	<p>II. However, a second Overseas player (“the second player”) may be registered, on or before 31st May of each year provided that the first player registered in the same year (“the first player”) has not played in a league game that same year and on registration of the second player the registration of the first player shall lapse.</p> <p>III. A Member Club may be required to produce a player’s passport or any other documentary evidence e.g. Bank Statements and/or Utility Bills, as the Executive may reasonably require to enable it to make its decision on the question of “ordinarily resident” or “resident” status. The decision of the Executive on any question of “ordinarily residence” or “resident” status shall be full and binding on both the player and the Member Club.</p> <p>IV. Any player who played in the Division 2 in the preceding year other than as an Overseas Player and who would still qualify as such within the Conditions relating to Division 2, shall not be an Overseas Player for the purposes of the above provisions when playing for the same club in Division 1.</p> <p>V. An Overseas player may play in any XI subject to playing conditions relating to players having played in higher divisions.</p>
(f)	<p>I. Any new contracted player must be registered by 31 May unless he obtains his contract after the 31 May in that same year. If a player obtains a contract with a County Club or the MCC Groundstaff after 31st May then he must be registered immediately and before he plays.</p> <p>II. Any Contracted player CURRENTLY registered for a club in the previous season does not have to re-register each year if he continues to play for that same Member Club. However, if he changes County Club or Member Club he must be re-registered with his new details.</p> <p>III. Any Contracted Player who subsequently leaves a club must be de-registered from that club with immediate effect.</p> <p>IV. A club may play any or all Home Contracted Players, however:</p> <p>a) A Contracted Player (either Full or Home) shall only be entitled to play in the First XI side of a Member Club.</p> <p>b) Member Clubs in the Premier Division only of the Championship 1st XI may play two Full Contracted Players in any one match providing that at least one player is contracted to Surrey CCC. A Member Club may therefore elect to play a Full Contracted Player who is contracted to a county other than Surrey CCC alongside a Full Contracted Player allocated to that club by Surrey CCC. If available, a Surrey CCC Full Contracted Player shall be selected ahead of a non-Surrey CCC Full Contracted Player.</p>
(g)	<p>A player who is resident in England and Wales and would be either Category 1 or Category 3e status, but for having relocated outside of England and Wales for temporary work or educational purposes (unrelated to Cricket), for a period of no more than 24 months may apply to the league to be considered as Category 1 or Category 3e status immediately on his return to England and Wales. Approval is at discretion of the league and is not automatic.</p>
(h)	<p>Any player who satisfies both the requirements of an Overseas and Contracted Player shall be registered as a Contracted Player. However, notwithstanding registration as a Contracted Player, all other conditions and restrictions in these Playing Conditions shall apply as if that player had been registered as a Contracted Player. In particular, any such player shall be included in the quota of Full Contracted Players permitted by these Playing</p>

	Conditions, and as such the overseas player, as a contracted player, can only play in the 1 st XI of the said club.
(i)	<p>I. No player joining a club from outside of the Surrey Championship shall make his initial league appearance of the season in any of the Divisions of the First or Second XI League in the last four matches of the current season without the prior sanction of the Executive on application made by 2.00pm on the Wednesday prior to the date of a Match.</p> <p>II. For the purpose of this Playing Condition a playing member of a club in the Surrey County League shall be deemed to be playing Championship cricket.</p>
(j)	<p>I. No Member Club shall play without the prior sanction of the Executive on application made by 9.00pm on the Wednesday prior to the date of a Match, any player in any game of The Championship in the last four matches of any season of the Championship who has played during that season in twelve or more matches for any Member Club in any of the Divisions of a higher League.</p> <p>II. For the purpose of this Playing Condition only, higher League shall include Divisions of the Surrey County League.</p>
(k)	In the event that any Member Club is found to be in breach of any of the Main Playing Conditions above concerning contracted players, overseas players, registration and player restrictions by playing in any match an ineligible player the Rules and Playing Conditions Sub-Committee of the Executive Committee shall have absolute discretion under R11 (b), to impose such penalty as is deemed appropriate including the imposition of a points deduction and or a financial penalty.
